Guadalupe's Mexican Years

2,418 days. That was the period Blessed Guadalupe Ortiz spent in Mexico: six years, seven months and twelve days.

What led a young Spanish woman to leave behind everything she knew, to embark on the adventure of bringing the message of holiness in the middle of the world to a new continent? Great faith, great courage, and a firm certainty about the mission she had received.

Perhaps that same determination had led her, years earlier, to enrol at the age of 16 at the Central University of Madrid to study Chemical Sciences, in an environment where 86% of students studying scientific degrees were men. Spanish university lecture halls had opened their doors to women only 23 years earlier. Now, Guadalupe set her own pace: that of a woman passionate about knowledge, driven by a firm conviction in the importance of women's presence in science.

Guadalupe arrived in Mexico in March 1950, at the age of 34, at a time when crossing the Atlantic was unusual for a young, unmarried woman. Soon after her arrival, she enrolled at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM) to pursue doctoral studies in Chemical Sciences. UNAM, now the country's largest public university with more than 300,000 students, then had around 35,000 and was a vibrant and diverse centre of thought.

Science classrooms continued to be predominantly male spaces, and women's participation in research was still in its early stages. It would be three more years before the constitutional reform granting Mexican women the right to vote was enacted in 1953 – a milestone marking the beginning of more active participation in the country's public and professional life.

In this context, it is not surprising how Guadalupe faced daily life like so many of us, making the most of every hour of the day and balancing the demands of personal, professional and academic life. In her case, she also had responsibilities for formation and apostolic initiative in presenting the message of Opus Dei in her new country. Guadalupe was convinced that she lived her vocation with the same intensity both in the university lecture theatre and while accompanying a group of young mothers in their Christian formation. As she herself wrote to Saint Josemaría on 12 December 1955 from Mexico: "I want to do it as well as possible, but sometimes I put my foot in it; never mind."

Her call to follow God in Opus Dei enabled her to see every dimension of her life as an opportunity to love and serve those around her, putting her talents into action and allowing the love that was the fruit of her relationship with God to be the unifying element. The 2,418 days she spent in Mexico cannot be measured solely by the hours devoted to each activity: every moment offered to God became an occasion to bring souls closer to Him, serving with joy and with the hope of transforming the world.
