Greatness of spirit

Jesus Christ is perfect God and perfect man, and he has established that his grace divinises us on a well-disposed human foundation. In Paquita and Tomás, the greatness of spirit shone through clearly. Manifestations of this magnanimity included high aspirations and an appreciation for the value of little things, 'which can only be seen through eyes dilated by love' (Blessed Alvaro del Portillo, Letter, 30 September 1975). True love is elegant and rejects what is vulgar and coarse. Tomás and Paquita did not dissociate ethics from aesthetics. For example, they lived with propriety in dress and speech, a consequence of their human and Christian dignity and of the respect that others deserve.

Isabel Bueno, who worked for many years in their home, wrote: 'In that house, there was a lot of affection, a lot of love; there, they made me appreciate the importance of little things. Both the children and I were nourished in this spirit of little things. Later, I instilled it in my own children, and I try to express it in concrete details: a well-prepared meal, a timely phone call...'

A couple from Paraguay who had the opportunity to meet them occasionally in Madrid testify: 'The detail, the conversation, the human tone of that couple made us leave delighted when we were invited to their home; our comment was that they had something special.'

Pilar, daughter of the Alvira couple, recalls: "On one occasion, during the summer season, I went to Mass with my father. In the church, there were quite a few people dressed too casually, with unkempt clothing and in a way that they probably would not have considered appropriate for participating in a social event of a certain level. My father then looked at me with a sad face and said in a very low voice: 'We lack faith!' Those words revealed his love for God, which he sought to live out with refinement in the details."
