
Love for the Church

As Montse's love for God grew, she advanced rapidly in her love for the Church. She was born on 10 July 1941 into a large, Catholic family who lived according to their faith. She felt in her soul that the Lord was calling her to follow him in Opus Dei and - after meditating calmly on this possibility in her prayer, and asking for advice – on 24 December 1957 she said yes. In the summer of that year she had been overjoyed when her older brother decided to enter the seminary and from then she prayed especially for priests. In the Work she immediately learned to pray to God every day for the Pope, for the bishop of her diocese and for unity in the Church.

Shortly afterwards she began to have pains in her legs and she was diagnosed with incurable bone cancer. At seventeen, Montse was well aware of how serious this was. In front of the image of the Virgin of Montserrat that the family had in their home, she accepted the Will of God and from then on she lived with extraordinary serenity.

Her parents wanted to give her something joyful to look forward to and offered her a trip to Rome to meet Saint Josemaría and to pray for the Pope and the Church at the tomb of Saint Peter in the Vatican. Everything was organised speedily, and she was in Rome from 11 to 17 November 1958. Montse was thrilled: to be close to the Pope! Those days, despite the pain she was suffering and a storm during the flight, she was very happy, because she was able to go to pray in St. Peter's Basilica and to see Rome. They were not able to see St John XXIII, as the trip did not coincide with any audience, of which there were far fewer than now. During those days Montse lived in a centre of the Work and met people of Opus Dei from other countries. She was able to greet Saint Josemaría with whom she spent some time. The Founder of the Work was moved by Montse's integrity and supernatural outlook.

The Servant of God's love for Jesus Christ led her to have a filial devotion to the Church. This aspect of her behaviour is also an example for us, for, as Saint Cyprian says: "No one can have God for his Father if he does not have the Church for his Mother."
