

SOWERS OF PEACE AND JOY

St Josemaría always preached, in word and in writing, what we read in one of his homilies: "We Christians should launch out along all the paths of the earth to be sowers of peace and joy with what we say and what we do" (Christ is passing by, 168).

Bishop Javier Echevarría, the previous Prelate of Opus Dei, lived with the St Josemaría in Rome for twenty-five years. In his book *Memoria del Beato Josemaría Escrivá* ("Memories of Blessed Josemaría Escrivá") he described him as follows: "He stood out as a perennially serene person, without sudden ups and downs or changes of mood. He always maintained perfect control over the impulses of his character. Of course, he was not insensitive to events, but he acted with peace and strength, no matter how pressing the problems, joys or sufferings."

He added later: "He declared – and this was no mere formula – that he only had friends: friends on the right and friends on the left. And he insisted that we could not close the doors of our hearts against those who came to us, wherever they came from. He never refused to shake hands with people he knew, if they were involved in unpleasant situations, motivated by malice, slander or misunderstanding. I remember several clerics, fallen from favour and abandoned by their companions and by those who had served them, who found companionship in Monsignor Escrivá. He did not hide his friendship with these people even from those who had created the unpleasantness for them."



ANECDOTES

Bishop Echevarría also tells some small but very significant stories. One took place at an international airport. “At the end of one of his trips to South America, in a spontaneous conversation, the cabin crew told Bishop del Portillo and me that their work on this trip had been different. And they explained, each in their own way, this same feature: ‘This route lasts more than eleven hours, with stopovers, and we have to attend to so many needs of the flight officers and passengers. Normally we end up exhausted, just wanting to finish, and we find it hard to be nice. We have to say that today’s journey has been completely different: We feel humanly rested, because we have an inner peace that we have received from our conversation with Monsignor Escrivá.’”

Another story, this time set in a working-class neighbourhood: “During his catechesis in Spain and Portugal in 1972, he received some workmen in Madrid, two of whom belonged to Opus Dei. They had formed a trio of clowns in their free time to entertain the people of the poorest districts. They told him that on many occasions, when it was time to perform, they would get there tired out by the day’s work. He listened to them affectionately and, on saying goodbye to them, he confirmed that those of us who are in love with God must be constantly concerned to make life pleasant for others: **‘You can make it even more pleasant by your job, giving a supernatural meaning to those antics that entertain people, and offering all your efforts so that they have the joy that belongs by right to the children of God.’**”

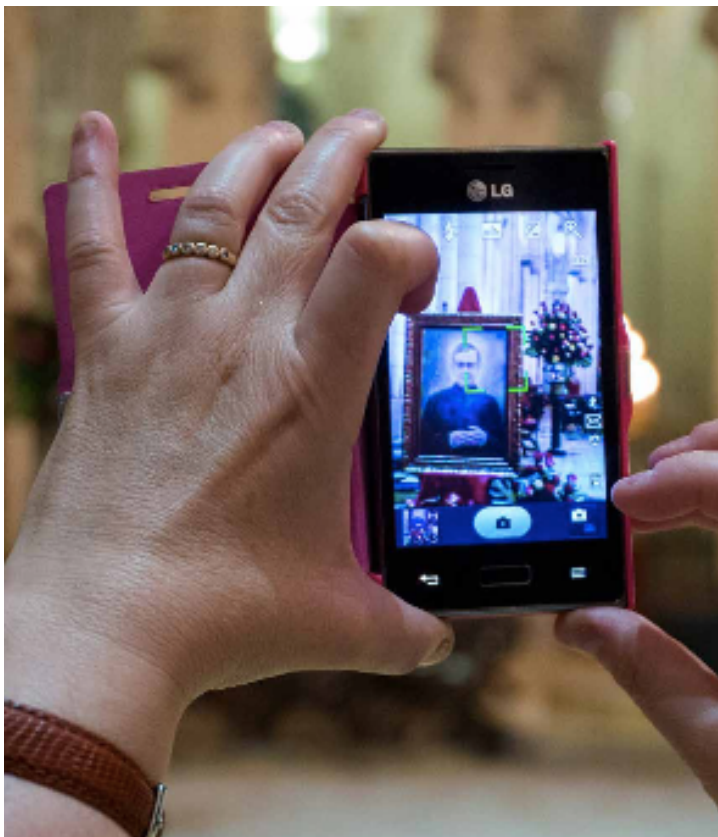
Prayer group

The inspection went well, and enabled me to put a higher price on the transfer.

At that moment a potential buyer appeared, who studied my proposal little by little. She ended by accepting it one hundred percent. She is a good professional. She has taken over my practice. She paid for it without any problems. The patients are very happy with her. She has also kept the staff: two assistants with more than thirty years at the practice. This had been a problem or a "pipe dream", because we never thought that she would agree straight out to keep both of them on, with the same salaries and working hours.

The Way of the Cross, Eighth Station, 3

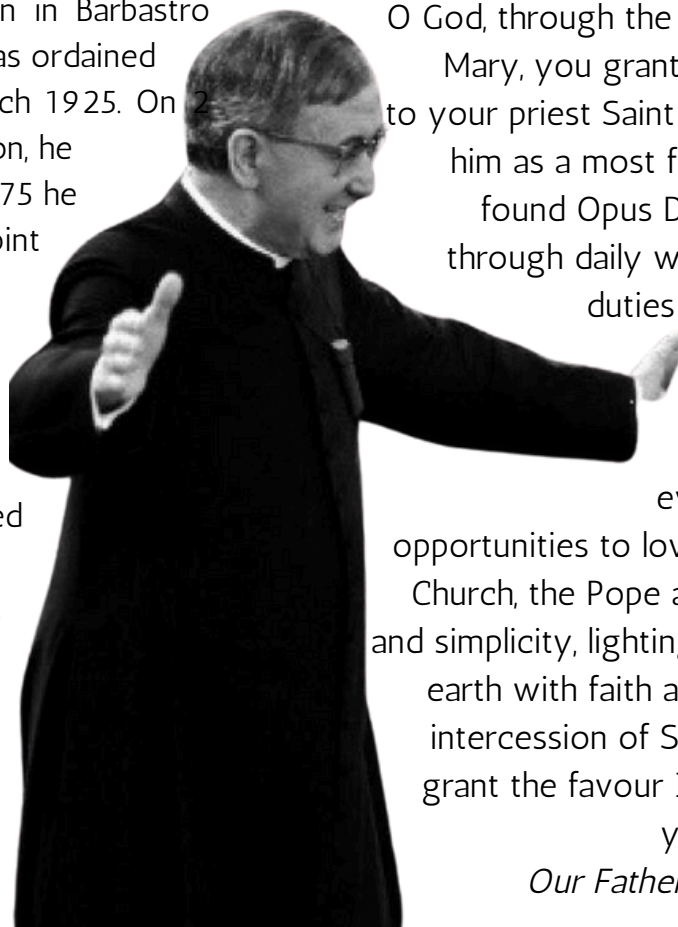
We must bring people together, we must understand others, we must make allowances.

BIOGRAPHY

Saint Josemaría Escrivá was born in Barbaastro (Spain) on 9 January 1902. He was ordained a priest in Saragossa on 28 March 1925. On 2 October 1928, by divine inspiration, he founded Opus Dei. On 26 June 1975 he died suddenly in Rome. At that point Opus Dei had spread to the five continents, serving the Church with the same spirit of full union with the Pope and the bishops that Saint Josemaría always practised. St. John Paul II canonised him in Rome on 6 October 2002. His feast is celebrated on 26 June. The mortal remains of Saint Josemaría Escrivá rest in the Prelatic Church of Our Lady of Peace, Viale Bruno Buozzi 75, 00197 Rome, Italy.
